ITINERARY

Please note day to day itinerary may be subject to change without notice due to weather conditions.

Day 1

Upon arrival into Yellowknife meet your driver and transfer to the Explorer Hotel for check in.

This afternoon meet the group in the lobby and enjoy an afternoon visit to the legislature and visitors center followed by a Welcome Dinner.

Day 2

This morning enjoy a Yellowknife City Tour. This afternoon embark on a 2 hour snowshoeing tour. Later this evening head to the lakeside cabin to enjoy your first night viewing of the Aurora.

Day 3

Enjoy a later start and enjoy an afternoon dog sledding tour and drive down the ice road to Dettah, a local First Nations community. Tonight enjoy your second evening of viewing the Northern Lights

Day 4

Another restful morning followed by an afternoon Bison Tour. Tonight enjoy your last viewing of the Aurora.

Day 5

On your final day enjoy an afternoon ice fishing tour with a local aboriginal including lunch.

This evening enjoy a Farewell Dinner with the group sharing stories and photos of a memorable few days.

Day 6

This afternoon enjoy a 4-5 hour nature tour to the Ingraham Trail, exploring and searching for the Ptarmigan and other local wildlife, the Wishing Tree, Cameron Falls and Vee Lake.

Following a late check out, transfer to the airport for your departure flight.

DEPOSIT

A deposit of \$300.00 CAD per person is required at time of booking.

Once minimum numbers are met the deposit will become non-refundable.

FINAL PAYMENT

The final balance payment is due on or before January 18, 2022.

Once paid the full amount of the trip is non-refundable.

COVID PROTOCOL

All guests must agree to wear a mask while in enclosed areas and in vehicles for the duration of the tour.

This will mean a mask in the public spaces of the hotel, tourist sites like the Legislature, Diamond Centre etc, and inside the trapper's cabin while aurora viewing. Masks can be removed while eating and drinking. Hand sanitizer and disinfecting wipes will be provided in the cabin and on the vehicle. A 20-passenger vehicle will be used to ensure there is more space for guests.

These protocols are subject to change with new or updated requirements by provincial health authorities.

PHYSICAL REQUIRMENTS

This adventure does not require a significant level of physical fitness.

However, we will be exposed to extremely cold weather, often experiencing temperatures with wind chills, which can be physically challenging.

Participants should be able to walk up to 1km, accumulated, over the day but the activities provided are optional for guests.
